Ontario Premier Doug Ford has revealed that Friday July 17, will be the beginning of Phase 3 of COVID-19 measures. Almost all businesses can open, except in Toronto and in a number of other regions such as Peel, Windsor and Niagara. Businesses reopening include movie theaters, indoor dining restaurants and gyms. The limit on indoor gatherings will be increased from 10 to 50 people, while the limit on outdoor gatherings will now be 100 people while maintaining social distancing. The province will not reopen amusements parks, buffet-style food services, water parks, overnight children's camps, dancing at nightclubs, deliberate contact during sports, as well as saunas and steam rooms. Ford is still of the hope that children will return to school full-time and in-person by the Fall. The province still recommends that people work remotely where possible and no word has been provided on when Toronto and the other regions still in Stage 2 will enter Stage 3.

As more populated regions are entering Phase 3, an understanding of how the virus spreads is immensely important to reduce the transmission. Business and property managers are beginning to welcome consumers back, many to indoor areas which may be better at facilitating the transmission of the virus. According to health officials, COVID-19 is mostly spread by large droplets during close and unprotected contact. These droplets often fall to the ground due to their size and do not remain aloft in the air. However, other types of contact, such as surface contamination, airborne transmission, or transmission via fecal matter, may also be possible. These are being studied and more answers are coming to light as we begin to better understand the virus.

A contaminated surface is known as a fomite. According to the US Centre for Disease Control and Prevention and other health authorities, COVID-19 transmission from fomites appears to be low. Although early studies have shown that COVID-19 may live on surfaces for hours to days, it is unclear whether the virus remaining on the surface is active and viable, and able to cause an infection. With months and millions of infected, there does not appear to have been many confirmed cases of acquiring COVID-19 from surfaces. A few exceptions have occurred, with a recent story of a woman riding the elevator alone who went on to infect 71 people through other contacts. In order for the virus to be spread via fomites, it would require a large and viable load of the virus to end up on a surface, from which enough material would have to be picked up by an individual's fingers and then spread to the nose, mouth or eyes. However, as in the elevator example, it just takes one infection to quickly turn into 71. Additionally, as restaurants reopen for indoor dining, it is unclear what fomite transmission means for when drinking and eating utensils which are not properly sanitized.

Recently, WHO was criticized for not having any guidelines regarding COVID-19's possible airborne transmission ability. Airborne transmission occurs when droplet nuclei (aerosols) remain suspended in the air over time. This is most common during medical procedures such as intubating a COVID-19 patient. To date, not enough evidence has been found to confirm aerosol transmission, particularly as we do not know how many aerosols are produced while talking or coughing, although studied have shown that aerosols are increased with amplified vocalization. Additionally, we do not yet know how much of the virus a person must come into contact with in order to cause an infection.

Should the virus be transmitted via aerosols, a strong Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning System (HVAC) may be able to assist in reducing the impact. Two studies have looked into transmission in HVAC systems, including







one from China that suggests the air conditioning in a restaurant may have been attributed to a transmission of COVID-19 from an individual in one table to other families sitting in tables nearby. There does not appear to be much clear evidence of transmission of COVID-19 by HVAC systems in hospitals or health care facilities; however, there is likely a "mechanistic possibility" of such. The likely theory at the moment appear to be related to longer distance localized droplet spread that has been facilitated by airflow, rather than classic airborne transmission.

What does this mean for business reopening? As far as we are currently aware, the best way to reduce transmission indoors is to wear a mask and keep two meters distance between people. Although transmission cannot be fully ruled out, more evidence is suggesting that we may not need to worry as much as previously suggested about surface contamination, as it is not viewed as the main transmission method. That does not mean we should stop continuous sanitization of high touch surfaces in public places. An investment in a strong ventilation system is worthy of discussion and may provide consumers with increased confidence that businesses are taking every measure possible to reduce the spread. Increased consumer confidence will assist in restarting the economy and which in turn will begin to reduce the level of fear in our communities.





- Trudeau announced that the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy program has been extended until December.
   Eligible business may apply for 75% funding for employee wages. The program was not initially as popular as
   expected, likely due to the application process which required companies provide extensive documentation.
   However, it began to gain traction and the fiscal snapshot suggests the program will cost \$82.3 billion, almost
   double its original estimate. \$18 billion has been paid to date, with 581,000 application approved out of
   587,060 received.
- Starting Saturday, July 18, face masks or coverings will be mandatory in all indoor public spaces in Quebec. Exemptions will be made for people who cannot wear them due to medical problems, as well as anyone under 12, although kids as young as two are encouraged to wear a mask. Starting August 1, fines could be given to those who do not wear a mask, but for now, those who do not wear one may be denied entry. Albertans are also "strongly recommended" to wear face coverings when entering indoor public places.

- The COVID-19 positivity rate is at its highest in Texas, standing at 16.33% on Saturday. This percentage assists in understanding the spread of the virus, as it doesn't reflect just an increase in testing. Houston Mayor Sylvester Turner has proposed a stay-at-home order for the county, which saw more than 27,600 active cases on Sunday, in an effort to manage the spread. The US Army is sending almost 600 medical personnel to Texas to assist hospitals with caring for patients.
- Approximately half of the world's daily COVID-19 new cases are in the USA and Brazil. California has now
  ordered all counties to close indoor operations, including restaurants, bars, movie theatres and museums.
  Any outdoor activities are still allowed, where possible. The testing positivity rate for the state has now
  increased to 7.4%, with almost 6,500 people hospitalized in California.




