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2. INSIGHT and SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

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With such disparities between Canadian and American COVID-19 infections, the question of border control is front of mind for many. Canada is seeing a continued decline of COVID-19 cases, while the USA has seen over 60,000 new cases for five days in a week. Los Angeles County has now reached more confirmed COVID-19 cases than all of Canada combined and Florida has exceeded the number of total cases in the UK.

In July alone, 31 flights arriving internationally or domestically in Canada have had possible COVID-19 exposure. Affected flights include 17 international flights, originally from areas such as Cancun, Islamabad, Zurich, Paris, and various American destinations, as well 14 domestic flights from Montreal, Toronto, Calgary, and Kelowna and other Canadian locations.

As Canada is reducing its community spread, it must ensure the virus does not enter from other places in order to continue down the path of success. According to the BC Centre for Disease Control (CDC), from May 19 to July 8, 2020, 7.7% of infections are likely related to international travel, a total of 40 cases.¹ In Ontario, from June 21 to July 4, 2020, an average of 4.9% of cases were related to travel, with a total of 1,763.² No information was available on whether these individuals adhered to self-isolation orders or that they contributed to the spread of COVID-19 to local populations.

Over two million people have entered Canada since the beginning of the quarantine rules, and according to the Public Health Agency of Canada, no one has been arrested but several fines have been administered by the agency. It appears that most travellers seem to be following the two-week self-isolation requirements after entering Canada. When a traveller is suspected to not follow the rules their case is flagged and assigned to the police of jurisdiction to follow up. As of July 9, over 21,000 cases were referred to the RCMP, of which only a few required a physical compliance check. No arrests have been made to date, and a handful of fines have reportedly been issued, suggesting that there could be a lack of enforcement. The RCMP are reported to have issued approximately six fines, while Ontario Provincial Police has issued two to a Florida couple that violated the Quarantine Act.

As knowledge regarding the lack of enforcement spreads, it is not beyond reason to expect that many will simply ignore the protocols. Together with others who may not have an awareness of the requirements could undermine efforts at containing the virus. A recent example was noted of an American who travelled to Nova Scotia and did not self-isolate and subsequently infected another individual that later traveled to PEI, which resulted in a cluster of five cases. Canadian boaters are sounding the alarm that American vessels are docking in Canada despite border controls, suggesting that crossing by air, land and sea are potentially a weakness for Canada.

Americans continue to enter Canada for non-essential travel such as shopping and recreation. From March 22 to July 12, over 10,300 US citizens were turned away at the border, with one in four admitting they were entering






Canada for tourism purposes. About 500 advised they were coming for shopping purposes, and approximately half of all those who were denied were denied due to "other reasons" - which the Canada Border Services Agency would not reveal. During the same period, about 800 foreign nationals, who were not from the USA, were also turned away after advising they came to shop. There have also been reports of US residents who were able to make it into Canada by utilizing a loophole which allows Americans to travel through Canada in order to access Alaska by road. In June, seven Americans were fined because they stopped at Banff National Park instead of heading directly to Alaska as required.

Canada may have reduced the number of COVID-19 cases, yet it is not difficult to look south and see how fast COVID-19 can spread without adequate measures in place. The number of COVID cases in the US, combined with the lack of safeguards being implemented, is a cause for concern in Canada. The situation is likely to get worse as desperation takes hold of the increasing number of unemployed and financially challenged, who are unable to acquire health insurance. Without employment, money or healthcare it is likely that protests and crimes of opportunity – such as looting – could occur in areas that are hardest hit. Combine desperation with the largest rate of gun sales in US history and a potential for violence is unmistakeable.





- Although Canada has been able to reduce its overall COVID-19 cases, Alberta has seen its highest COVID-19 jump in daily cases with 120 announced Thursday. Quebec has also seen a slight daily increase, and Canadian cases jumped to over 400 in just a few weeks.

4. COVID-19 IN USA



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- This week, the Trump administration has rerouted all hospital data on COVID-19 patients to the government
 instead of to the USA CDC. Stating that the old system was inadequate, a new faster and complete data system
 will streamline all government response, with the CDC participating in the response but no longer controlling
 it. The new database is not available to the public, possibly affecting the ability of researchers and health
 officials relying on the CDC data to make projections and health decisions.
- Florida surpassed 300,000 confirmed infections this week, with its daily average deaths continuing to rise, and a daily record set on Thursday with 156 deaths. No state-wide order has been issued for compulsory mask wearing, at this time.
- Texas is seeing COVID-19 transmission spreading to more rural counties, as well as nursing homes. Although the recent uptick in cases has been mostly related to young people, it is not spreading to older individuals who are more at risk of severe complications of the virus.



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










14. APPENDIX B – Phase 1 to 3: Progression on Managing COVID-19 Pandemic
