Hurricane Laura. This week Hurricane Laura slammed into the Louisiana and Texas coasts, sending residents in areas hit hard by the coronavirus pandemic rushing to find shelter. The hurricane was among the strongest storms ever to hit the U.S., and more than 500,000 residents in its path were advised to evacuate. In Texas, many traditional shelters, which were running at lower capacity to allow for social distancing, had filled up by Wednesday morning. Across the region, evacuees were instead urged to book hotel and motel rooms as a safer way to isolate themselves from others who might be infected with the coronavirus. Resurgences. Flare-ups are now occurring in several countries that recently eased their lockdowns and travel restrictions. Germany and France have set tougher rules in line with a growing number of countries battling a resurgence in coronavirus infections. This included Paris making masks obligatory in all public places. Meanwhile in Marseille the per capita rate of cases is more than four times that of the national rate which prompted local officials to mandate masks be worn in all outdoor areas of the city - following Toulouse and Nice which have introduced the same rule. In Africa, Kenya has extended a nationwide curfew by 30 days. Bars and nightclubs will stay closed for another month, but the number of people allowed to attend weddings, funerals and other events has been increased. Britain, South Korea and Rwanda are also tightening their restrictions as fear of a return to the harsh anti-virus controls put in place at the beginning of the pandemic earlier this year.

China. China has made substantial progress regarding COVID-19 control, as the local transmission of coronavirus has almost been stopped. However, flooding has been threatening the lives and homes of people in 27 provinces across central and southern China. The average precipitation in areas along the Yangtze River has reached the highest level since 1961. As of mid-August, at least 219 people had been killed, almost 1 million people needed emergency assistance, approximately 4 million people were evacuated, and 63 million people were affected by the flooding. India. India has recorded its highest one-day tally of coronavirus cases, with 77,266 new infections recorded. That is the second highest number of cases ever recorded by a single country in one day. Only the US has reported more cases.

Germany. The number of confirmed coronavirus cases in Germany increased by 1,571 to 239,507, data from the Robert Koch Institute for infectious diseases showed.

New Zealand. Auckland is on track to move out of level 3 lockdown on Sunday despite new cases of Covid-19. New Zealand's largest city has been in level 3 for more than two weeks and on Friday the finance minister said that at midnight on Sunday Auckland would move to level 2.

USA. In the United States, a growing number of states are pausing plans to reopen, amid rising infection counts. Several are re-imposing restrictions they had lifted earlier. There were already substantial variations in how states








were deciding to open-up, with some forging far ahead of others. The maps below show where several major sectors have reopened.



The changes reflect the pressure put on the governors to respond to a damaged economy and an uneasy public, even as epidemiologists warn of a second wave of cases. Many governors are mandating the wearing of masks in public places³.







